Heritage Week

Recently it was Heritage week at London Fields. We will be displaying all the learning from the week in a gallery in the school hall on Thursday the 29th of November after school. Until then, here is a sneak peak of what we got up to.

Year 1

Year One have been celebrating all the different places in the world that we come from. We have been embroidering, weaving, painting, cooking and have made our own Chinese lanterns and album covers for Jamaican music.



Year 2

We brought in items from home
