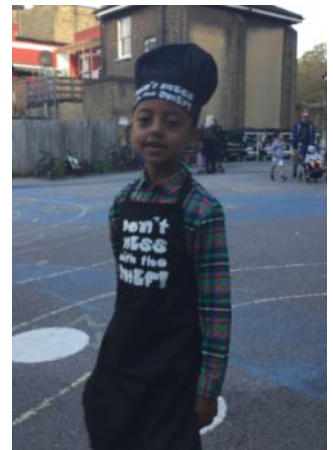
Year 3 Science

And others took it to a whole new level and brought in a pair of Minecraft heads.

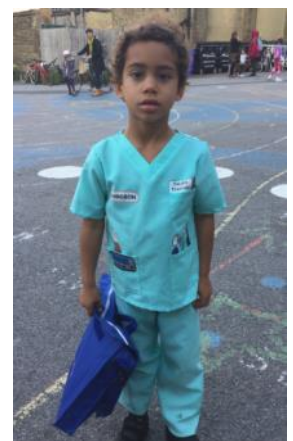
